One Night-3 hours -Just For Women



Audra's 2nd Poem – 8/25/21

I started my life out as a baby, ignorant of all the evil in life and free from sin But it didn't take long to learn and boy did the devil take over and win.

He had me believing that I could do whatever I wanted with no thought of being saved. I didn't know then but God had other plans for me and my road was set and already paved.

He let me go through all the hurt and pain and lonely years to get me to the spot Where I would finally hit my knees and beg Him to come into my life a lot.

And He gave me this talent of poetry and let me put words on paper about my life of sin But it was because now here I sit and He knew I could do a lot of good with this pen

To show kids and other people that they are not alone and to tell and show them the truth about this game.

And show them it's really not worth all the hurt and pain or the money and the fame.

God loves us to much He sent His only Son to die on the cross for us And some people still didn't believe in Him and all they did was cuss

But that God knew I would be sitting here in prison asking and begging for His blessing and all His love.

And He knew exactly what it would take to get me to turn to Him when push came to shove.

God came to Noah and told him to build the ark for the flood. Why? Because He knew we could only be saved by the spilling of His blood.

So when you're hurting and think you have no choice and your back is against the wall Then all you have to do is look and pray to the man above and hit your knees in prayer when you fall.

Because God loved us so much to give His only Son up to die for us to be saved now that is love. So how could you ever think He doesn't have our back when push comes to shove?

I still don't know what he wants me to do or what He has in store for me in His plan But just knowing how much He loves me and that He would give His only Son for me makes me want to be a better man.

So now I sit in my cell and I hit my knees and pray to him and ask Him to come into my life And to make me feel whole again and to help me use all my hurt and pain for good and all my strife.

So when you think you're all alone and you're ready to give up and you're tired of living in sin All you have to do is get on your knees and pray to Him and I promise as long as you do that truthfully you can't lose, you can only win.

So once again I thank the Lord for giving me a chance to do good with my words and experiences and this pen

And for saving me from myself and turning me to Him and away from my life of sin.
