Last Week Recap:

Kids Club theme was - No Fair! Our Bible story was about the older brother's reaction to the younger brother coming back home in the story of the prodigal son. We talked about our reaction to things we see as unfair and if it was unfair that Jesus died for our sins. We had green colored themed food for St. Patrick's Day, flew paper airplanes (youth had paper fans creating flying challenges). The cooking break out group made shamrock pretzels. The Lenten drama group worked hard on their skit they are going to perform the Thursday before Easter.

Children's Small Group (ages 3 – Grade 5) learned Sunday that fruit is better to eat than junk food & candy and that Jesus is better than fruit. We need to have a firm foundation built on Christ. Our Bible story was about the wise man & the foolish man - one built a house on sand & one built on rocks. Are you building on a solid foundation for when storms come in your life? We also put together pre-cut bird houses & painted them as well as played a fruit matching game.

Youth Group started a Lenten series. We took at what was a very hard look at what it looks like to follow Jesus. The Bible story was about when Abram and Sarai were called to leave their home and go where God was telling them to go. We discussed what it looks like to make sacrifices for the greater good, even when it means giving up something we really want. We talked about what we could sacrifice or give up during Lent, which was a hard decision for some.

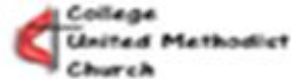
