

**Silent Auction for a Special Quilt  
April 3, April 10, April 17, and April 24**

Ruth Bebermeyer donated a quilt top to our church quilters which was hand-stitched by her mother, Vernie Bebermeyer. The quilt was mostly pieced with the use of feed sacks. Produce has been packaged in bags for over 100 years but during the boll weevil depression in the 1920's and in the Great Depression that followed, the feed sack fabric became widely used for clothing and bedcoverings. Flour, sugar, rice, cornmeal and of course seed and fertilizer products came in printed fabric sacks. These printed sacks were used for sewing from before these depressions in the United States to well after WWII. The quilt is in the nine patch design with a border made with current produced fabric. Our very own College Methodist Quilters quilted the large quilt which measures 96 X 105 inches and is made with polyester thick batting which makes for a very warm quilt and excellent for a bed covering. This precious quilt will be displayed next to the mission table starting Sunday, April 3. Each of four Sundays there will be opportunity to make a silent bid to purchase the quilt. One's bids can be put on slips of paper and put in a jar next to the quilt, the slips of paper are next to the jar. After church on Sundays the highest bid will be posted next to the quilt to let bidders know where the bidding is at. The last bidding will be on Sunday, April 24. Money raised through the silent auction will be applied toward the current CUMC music ministry. Ruth Bebermeyer was the music director and organist for CUMC for many years and it was thought that this would be a fitting tribute to her mother. Let's honor Vernie by bidding generously on this beautiful quilt.
